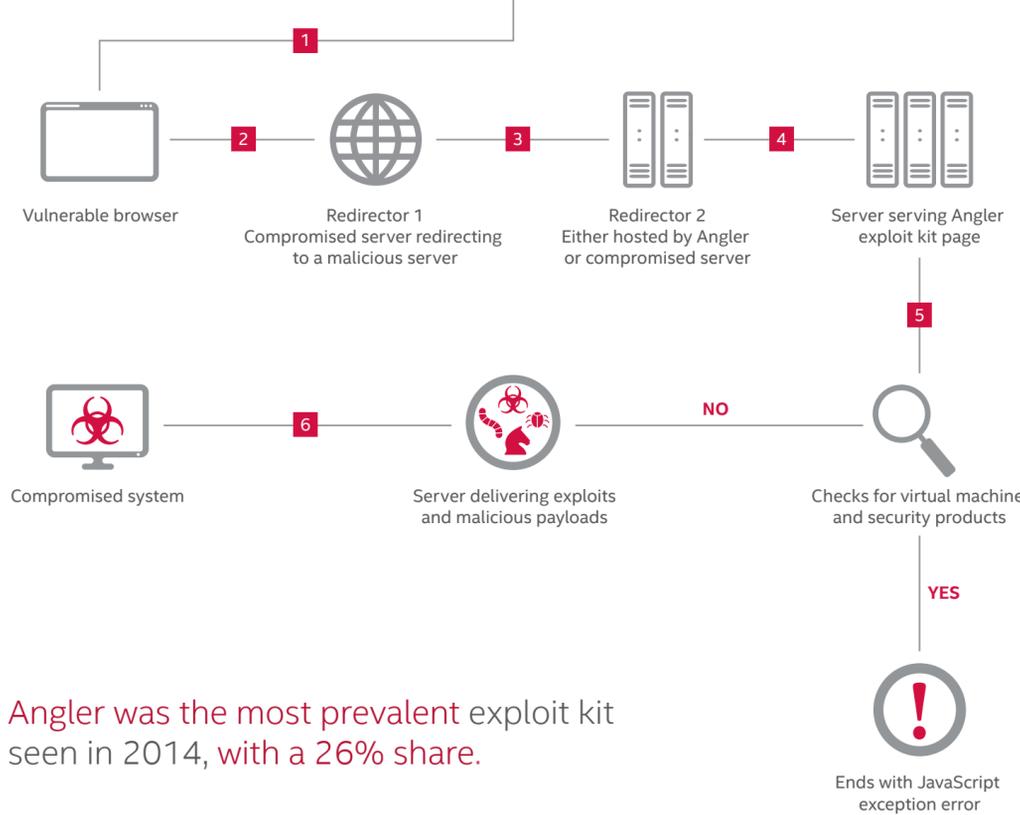
Angler Exploit Kit

Angler has taken over from Blacole as one of the most popular and powerful exploit kits.

Angler employs a variety of evasion techniques to remain undetected by virtual machines, sandboxes, and security software.



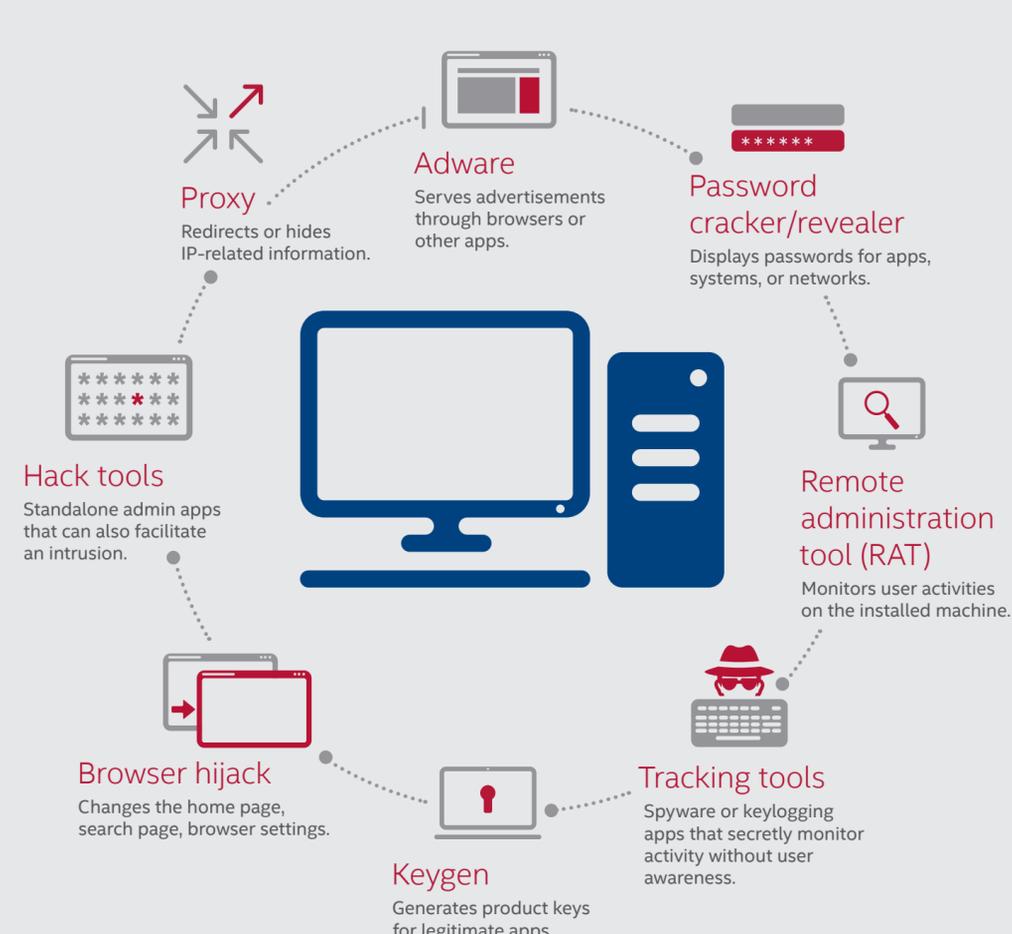

Potentially unwanted programs (PUPs) live in the world between nuisance and malicious malware and are becoming more aggressive.



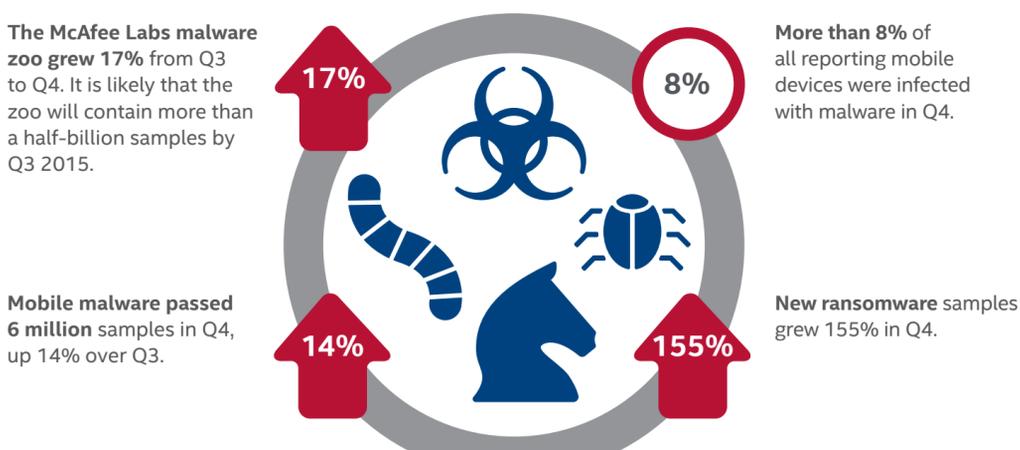
In a typical 24-hour period, McAfee Labs detects PUPs on more than 91 million systems.
